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Dear Parent/Carer

This week I spent time in school visiting lessons accompanied by teachers from Mackie Hill Junior and Infant school and I was overwhelmed with the positive attitudes to learning that I witnessed from the pupils who were all responding to the learning challenges being put before them by their teachers. It was great to see and it certainly reinforces the huge gains in learning and progress we are now seeing across the whole school community. Very well done to all the pupils and their teachers here. This week our school moved closer to securing its own future following the decision made by the Governing Body and Wakefield Local Authority to disband and remove the School Improvement Committee that has been working with the school to secure improvements following the Ofsted inspection in December 2017. This now means that a newly formed Governing Body will be in place for the start of the summer term. It will be chaired by Mr Denis Barry and the vice chair will be Mrs Helen Crooks. I have no doubt that they will be updating us all next term with their plans for the continued improvement of our school.

I have, however, saved the best bit of news until last! The Governing Body have now formally agreed to a permanent headteacher for Mackie Hill Junior and Infant School who will start in post from Friday 1st March 2019. This decision has been made with the full support of Dane Royd Junior and Infant School and Wakefield Local Authority and now allows the school to move forward under the direct leadership and guidance of a permanent headteacher.

I would like to congratulate Mrs Jayne Elliott with her success in obtaining the headship of Mackie Hill Junior and Infant School and wish her every success into the future with school. It is certainly well deserved and from the responses from pupils and staff in assembly yesterday morning when I informed them of this news, it is a choice that has everyone's full approval.
